pp.29-35 **“Learning and working in Tanzania” by WADA Natsuki**

WADA Natsuki wrote of her experiences in Tanzania as a volunteer, a student and a staff taking care of “Grant Assistance for Grass-Roots Human Security Projects” of Japanese Embassy in Tanzania. In her first year in University, she went to Tanzania as a participant in a work-camp and made friends with a boy with diabetes. She recalls the memory of a girl with diabetes in her primary school time. As a student of University of Dar es Salaam, she met students’ demonstration to demand increase of student loan in the campus. At first she was amused by the demonstrations. One day, however, a group of students who had discontent with the increase in price of foods attacked and destroyed a kiosk on campus. It was a familiar place for her, so she felt disappointed at students’ demonstrations. Last year she found a place to stay in Tanzania as a worker. Her advises on finding a job in Tanzania would be useful.
